1 SCOTS

August has been dominated by a well earned period of summer stand down for most of 3 SCOTS. However, there was no stand down for the 38 personnel currently deployed across East and West Africa, as their partnering tasks persist.

In Nigeria, Team 11 finished the second Advanced Operators Course with their Nigerian Partners. A total of 71 students graduated, in a ceremony in front of many esteemed guests. In Somalia, Team 12 have notably trained the 500th Somali soldiers since Jan 2017.

Since returning from leave, the rest of the Bn have been busy; as planning for their upcoming Ex in Belize continues at pace for the BHQ.

A Coy, who are now a third of their way through their training cycle, have been conducting a Commanders Cadre, developing Team OCs and 2ICs in skills they will require when deployed in austere environments.

2 SCOTS also welcomed CSIG on a visit to Palace Barracks. 2 SCOTS

2 SCOTS football team is currently on tour in Gibraltar. Having won their first game 3-2 against the Combined Services, the 2 SCOTS team are now preparing for their match against the Royal Gibraltar Regiment. The team are enjoying the warm weather and the beaches to cool down after training sessions. The team will have a battlefield tour of the rock, including being guided through the old WW2 tunnels - tabbing the scenic route to the top of the mountain (while dodging the monkeys).



C Coy will put their Foxhound (now painted green!) experience from Op SHADER to good use when they deploy to Norway for Exercise TRIDENT JUNCTURE 18. They will form part of a 40,000-strong multinational joint task force on one of the largest NATO exercises ever conducted - to demonstrate alliance capability and deter adversaries. C Coy will deploy in Oct 18 and will conduct a 2500Km march across Europe along with other units from 4 Inf Bde before training with other NATO forces. The Ex is seen as an important step in the development of the ability of light forces to operate effectively in Europe on NATO missions. It will see the Jocks learning to operate in extreme cold weather.
